

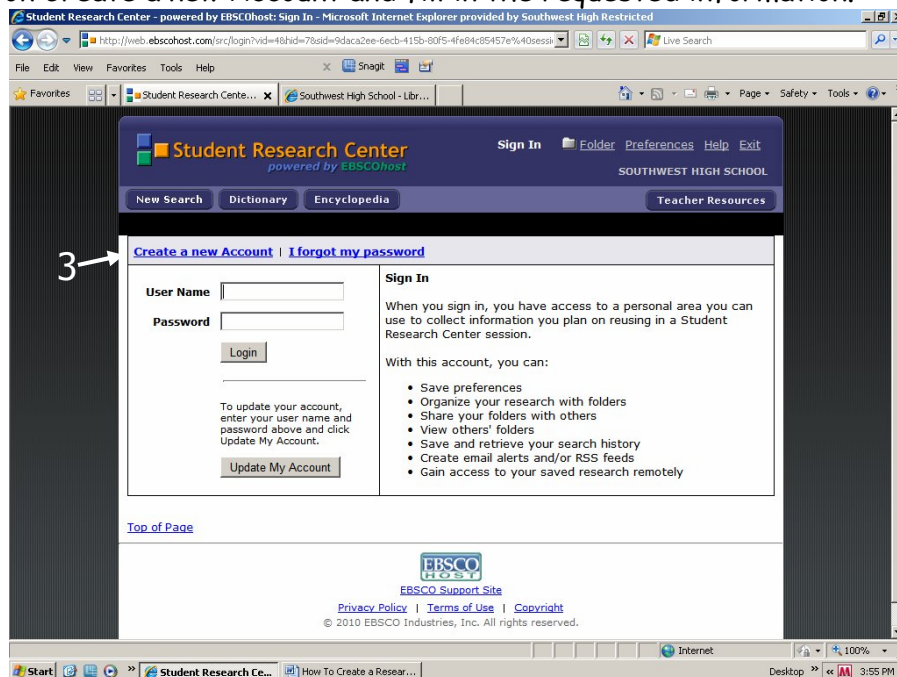
## Southwest High School Media Center How To: Create a Research Account in EBSCOHost

You are researching in EBSCOHost and find an article that is full of the types of information you need for your research. You've read about half of it and run out of time. What do you do? Save it in your research account. Follow these steps to create and use your account.

1. Go to the Student Research Center-High School and Middle School.
2. Click on the Sign In link.



3. Click on Create a new Account and fill in the requested information.



4. This is the information you fill out. Note that there is no where to put an email. Make sure you remember your password and username.
