Overview:

Academic Connections provides an opportunity for high school students with a 3.3 (or above) **weighted** cumulative GPA to get a jump start on the college experience. We invite students to explore the best UCSD has to offer. Students choose one of 27, three-week courses offered. Classes meet five hours a day, with a maximum of 22 students per class, to ensure quality interaction with instructors and instructional assistants. Academic Connections instructors are typically UCSD doctoral students who design and instruct the course. This engaging combination brings freshness and excitement to the classes.

Not only will the course be fun and exciting, students will have the opportunity to participate in activities in the afternoon, early evening and weekends. These activities include sports, arts and crafts, music, dances, talent shows and more. Participants are enabled to take advantage of the resources the beautiful UCSD campus has to offer. The resident halls are staffed with an experienced and trained Resident Dean, Assistant Resident Dean and Residential Assistants who, between them and the instructors, provide 24/7 supervision of the students.
