Policy Involvement

Southwest High School carries out the following legal requirements in the manner described below:

- 1. Convene annual meetings to inform parents of participating students of the requirements of Title I and their rights to be involved
 - Welcome-Home-To-Southwest- a meeting for incoming freshmen with their Link Crew mentors, explaining curriculum, assessments and proficiency levels students are expected to meet (parents are welcomed)
 - Back-To-School Orientation- an informational meeting for all parents at the beginning of the school year; its purpose is to assist parents in understanding academic content, standards and assessments and to provide a platform for communication throughout the year.
 - Spring Showcase- An informational meeting for all parents in the spring; its purpose is to assist parents in understanding academic content, standards and assessments and to ensure parents stay connected throughout the year.
 - Higher Education meetings- a series of meetings to inform parents and students on graduation requirements and college entrance requirements
 - Annual Title 1 meeting- an informational meeting to inform parents of all services made available by categorical programs and how they may contribute as equal partners, with a focus on parents of 9th grade students.
 - Financial Aid Meetings- a series of meetings for juniors and seniors and their parents to provide them with information about financial aid, scholarships and college applications
 - Coffee with the Counselors- a meeting for parents to meet the counselors and ask any questions regarding any issues
 - All tenth grade parents are invited to attend a conference with their student and counselor to prepare a student plan for graduation
 - Annual IB/AP Course informational meetings offered for parents and students.
- 2. Offer a flexible number of meetings

Meetings are offered on different days of the week and at different times in the evening and mornings. Meeting times are determined by the parent group at their first meeting.

- Involve parents of participating students in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of its Title I programs and Title I parental involvement policy*
 All meetings are announced in the Online Newsletter and via Blackboard Connect. The School Site Council meets on a monthly basis.
- 4. Provide parents of participating students with timely information about Title I programs Parents are informed via Newsletter, letters home, the school website, at meetings, the Blackboard Connect phone system, the Parent Portal, and on the school Marquee.
- 5. Provide parents of participating students with an explanation of the curriculum, academic assessment, and proficiency levels students are expected to meet.

Parents are informed during the listed meetings above and also with their annual parent-student counselor meeting.

6. Provide parents of participating students, if requested, with opportunities for regular meetings to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children.

All parents are invited to attend all meetings by special invitation in the mail, through the student bulletin and home telephone calls in English and in Spanish.

The School Site Council (SSC) is a group of parents, students, classified employees and teachers. The SSC is an organization that is elected by their peers to work with the principal to create a plan for school improvement.

The English Language Acquisition Committee (ELAC) is a group of parents that work with the Supervisor of Instruction to make sure that the school has programs in place to provide English Leaners with the necessary opportunities to graduate.

 - Welcome-Home-To-Southwest- a meeting for incoming freshmen and their Link Crew Mentors (parents are encouraged to attend and welcomed)
 - Intervention Study Team Meetings- a meeting for students at risk of not graduating or passing their courses
 - Back-To-School Orientation- an informational meeting for all parents at the beginning of the school year
 - Higher Education meetings- a series of meetings to inform parents and students on graduation and college entrance requirements
 - Annual Title 1 meeting an informational meeting to inform parents of all services available
 - School master activity calendar on the school's website

 - English classes are provided through our Adult Education classes
 - Parent Portal—parents may look at their students' grades, attendance and transcripts online
